There is a pressing need for Women-Centered and Women-Led safe spaces for People Living With HIV. As an Indigenous Community Researcher, Claudette Cardinal has led art-based projects: The ART OF The Matter...Double Vision and The Stat's Talk Back 2.0.

She proposes a third ancillary event to bring more voices to the fold to discuss side effects of ARV drugs and promote strength-based messages to uplift our spirits, specifically from the perspective of Women affected by HIV.

This event will include two parts: the first one in the morning, Women Living With HIV will be invited to share their experiences and stories of how HIV has affected their lives, using the Heart Body Mind Spirit – Medicine Wheel approach (emotional, physical, mental, spiritual). The conversation will be guided by Elder Sheila Nyman and Claudette Cardinal.

Part 2: CAHR – registration required (18 spots) + 7 – Elder, M. Fleury and Speakers.

In the second part of the event, we will open to a broader audience by inviting Allies, Researchers, Community Members and Trainees. The ART OF The Matter...Double Vision Video will be shown again, accompanied by a summary of the comments and reactions obtained from the morning session with the permission to present a summary.

Harmonizing and optimizing the use of HIV cohort studies in Canada

Cohort studies, using both administrative and consent-based data, are critical to monitor HIV outcomes over time and understand the impact of HIV on the lives of those living with it. There are multiple cohort studies across Canada with different research priorities, access to data, and target populations. We aim to bring key personnel from these studies together at CAHR to better understand the landscape of cohort studies in Canada, leverage each other's knowledge, build off technical infrastructure, and discuss methodologies to design and analyze data and future collaborations. This meeting will promote the collaboration of researchers across Canada and provide a platform for the exchange of knowledge among new and experienced researchers in this field.

The workshop is open to anyone involved with cohort studies, including trainees and community members. This will be an interactive, practical, and relevant one-day workshop. We will invite different experts across Canada to speak at this workshop.

Founded in partnership with Middlesex London Health Unit and London Inter-Community Health Centre, and operated by the Regional HIV/AIDS Connection, **Carepoint** is one

Ontario's first Consumption and Treatment Services (CTS) sites. Five years after opening as a temporary overdose prevention site, **Carepoint** moved into its new, purpose-built permanent location in February 2023. This harm reduction program provides a welcoming space for people who use drugs to access new equipment, use their drugs and access resources connected to harm reduction including HIV/HCV testing, over-dose prevention supports and wrap-around community resources without judgment.

Tours of **Carepoint** will be available on a first come first served basis, up to a maximum of 25 people per tour. Departing from the Delta Armouries hotel, the tour will include a short 10–12-minute walk to the site. Tours will begin promptly at 8am to have the least impact on services beginning at 9am.
